

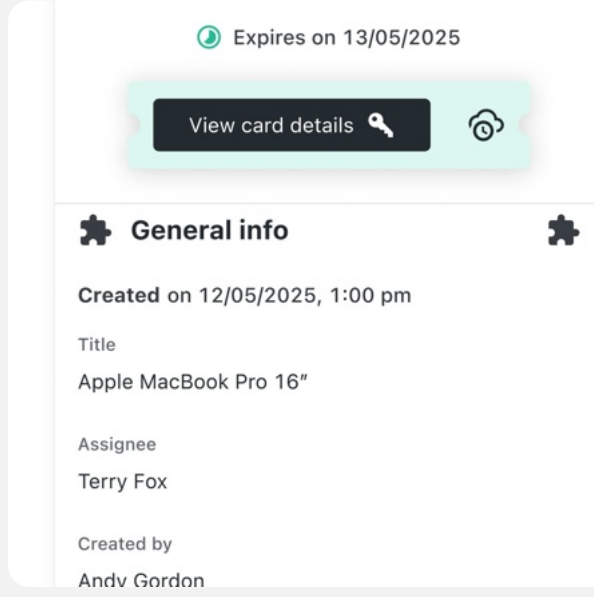



HR's 5 most loved Soldo features

1. Instant company cards

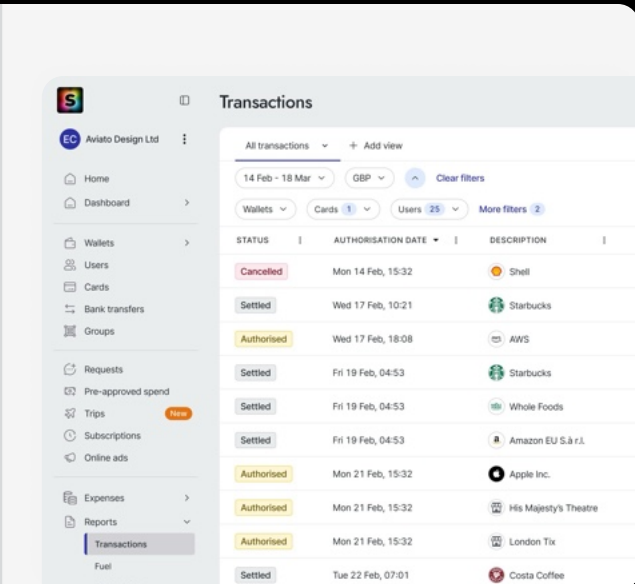

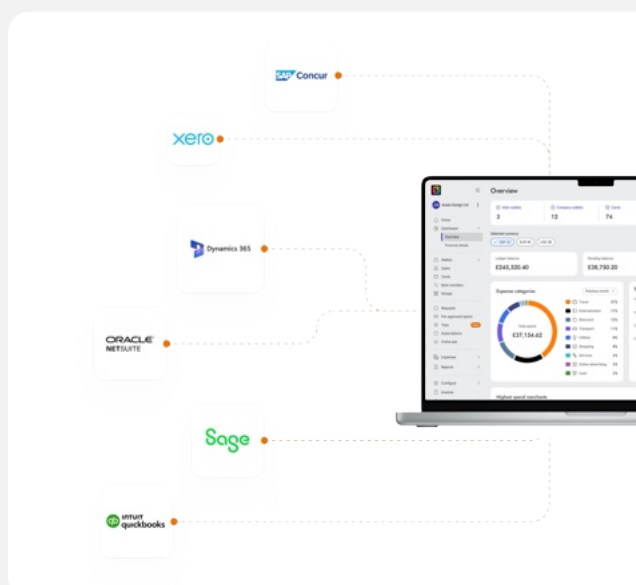
When a payment has been made, receipts are captured in the app at checkout. Soldo automatically matches them to the right transaction, so you don't have to chase and your finance team closes the month happy.

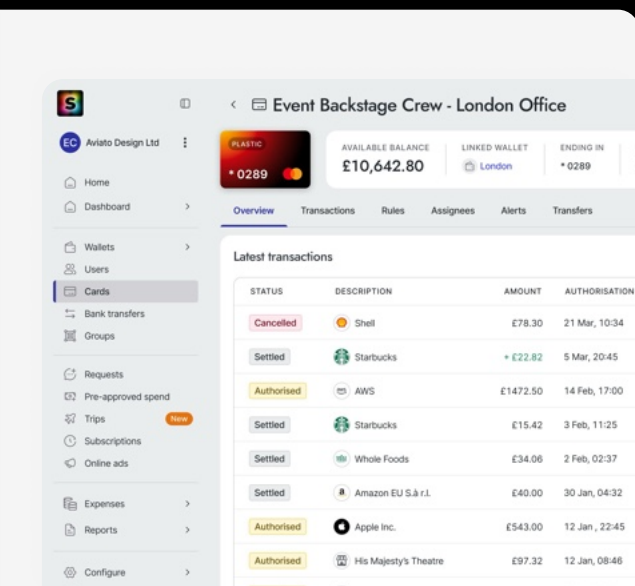
3. Integrations that keep HR in sync



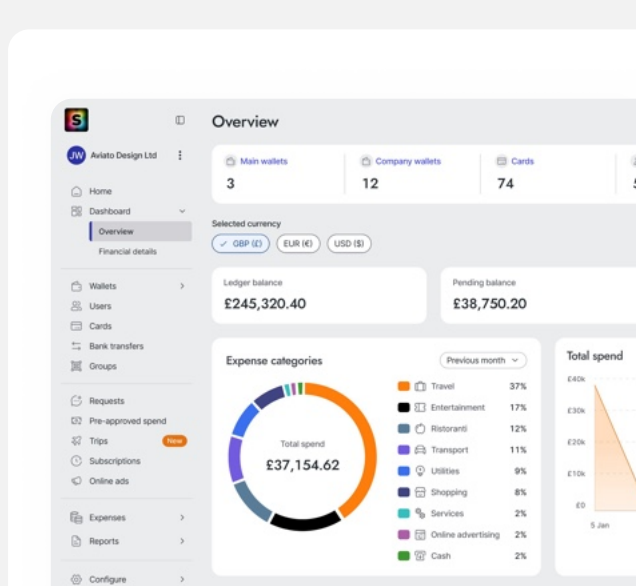
